
R U Familiar with Deuteronomy 13



The first question is, are you familiar with chapter 13 of Deuteronomy, which seriously warns us about before Jesus Christ appeared? About false prophets, teachers, and the Creator ONE (God(s)). Deuteronomy chapter 13 is not the only passage that has warned us about that. Several passages in the TANAKH (Hebrew Bible) also echo the same warnings in the Deuteronomy chapter 13. False prophets and the temptation to follow other creator ones, here are a few examples:

- **Deuteronomy 18:20-22**: This passage warns against prophets who speak in the name of other gods or who speak presumptuously in $\forall \neg$'s name in vain. It emphasizes that such prophets should not be feared and will face consequences for their false prophecies.
- **Jeremiah 23:16-17**: The prophet Jeremiah warns the people not to listen to the words of false prophets who speak visions from their minds and not from the mouth of $\forall \omega$ (I AM). These prophets often tell people what they want to hear rather than the truth.
- **Ezekiel 13:1-9**: Ezekiel speaks against false prophets who deceive the people with false visions and divinations. He declares that these prophets will not be part of the council of $\forall \neg$'s people and will face judgment.

Some other believers also believe that this so-called Jesus is the Creator ONE $\forall \neg$, who came down in the flesh, but do not realize or have been ignoring what $\forall \neg$ has warned us many times. Plus, the book of Numbers Chapter 23, verse 19 said that $\forall \neg$ is NOT a man (HUMAN), that he should lie, NOT a human being, and that HE should change his mind. Does HE speak and then not act? Does HE promise and not fulfill? The book of Hosea chapter 11, verse 9 also points out that $\forall \neg$ is not a man and never will. That is one of the reasons why this Jesus Christ cannot be the Creator ONE, $\forall \neg$.

Some others also believe that before Jesus came down from heaven in the flesh, he was this one chief angel (spirit messenger from heaven). This also cannot be true, because, in the TANAKH, angels are often depicted as divine spiritual beings who serve various roles, including as protectors. They are sent by $\forall \omega$ to carry out HIS will, deliver messages, and provide guidance and protection to humans. Their nature as spiritual beings set them apart from mankind, emphasizing their divine origin and purpose. We must also realize only mankind is to be called a "SON", the spiritual messengers (angels) cannot. We, as mankind, are created in the liken of $\forall \omega$. We are the sons and the spirit messengers are one of $\forall \omega$ divine beings, that it. Nowhere in the scripture mentioned that the spiritual messengers (Angels) are liken $\forall \omega$, and to be called sons. If you do see one said that, the scripture book you're reading is the bad translated book.

FYI, if any one of you mentioned a young (virgin) woman who was conceived and bore a son according to what Isaiah 7:14 said, is Mary who gave birth to Jesus. This is where they are often being fooled for not reading that scripture very carefully according to that prophecy woman in Isaiah 7:14 is Isaiah's wife. "...he (Isaiah) approached the prophetess and she conceived (tahar) and bore (taled) a son and God said to me: Name the child: "Maher-shalal-hash-baz" For before the child shall know how to cry my father my mother the riches of Damascus and the spoil of Samaria will be carried away before the king of Assyria" - Isaiah 8:4

As you can see, that isn't Jesus Christ at all. And what's more, <u>King Ahaz must see the sign of the prophecy to be fulfilled which did. He would be long dead for Jesus to appear as a sign</u>.
