



Rough Sports is like the Olympics Gladiator

Because they love playing or watching the sports game, to win, to take pride and get all the winning bidding wealth. Whichever kind of sports people play for fun and/or gamble. Whether they play and/or watch the rough sports or not. Most of these sports are rough and violence because there is always blood and death. People get hurt, die, get jealous or are arrogant. I, Bro. And the perverted mouth, I hate.” - Proverbs 8:13*

gifts shall live.” - Prov 15:27*

There are more reasons why **ﷲ** do not delight in the way people play sports and how they play with the body they live in. Not only how rough or violence they play, but how they use the body they live in sports. For example, female rugby players are wearing such outfits that are too tight or too short on their upper legs? Or do women gymnasts for Olympics athletes male and female who run for the race wear tight outfits as well? Often, they do show off pride in their body in a sexual way. Whether during the public game or how it ends up in the magazine. I know **ﷲ** do not support or like those selfish greedy proud boasting players. Even those who dress up improperly to show off their sexual body (Proverbs 7:10-27) is an evil doing. The same shame for the audiences who are watching for fun and pleasure.



The worst bloody abusive sport I could not believe why the US allowed the MMA (Mixed Martial Arts) and UFC (Ultimate Fighting Championship) sports in our country, because it is too violent a dangerous game. People do get killed over this and/or have a serious physical damage, especially to their face to the brain which can become mentally damaged. The US once forbade these dangerous fighting sports before the late 90's.

It's now become very clear that all sports, whether it is the most dangerous or not, are all for the money and pride. Yet, we shouldn't fool around or harm the body we live in. Did people not know that the body we live in is not our own but belongs to **ﷻ**?

*"Know that **ﷻ**, HE is Creator Almighty; he made us and we are his. We are his people and the sheep of his pasture." - Psalm 100:3*

"... he who fails to find me injures himself; all who hate me love death." - Proverbs 8:36

ﷻ wants us to stay pure, to set-apart away from the horrible pleasure of the world. We must not sacrifice ourselves for the pleasure of the evil world that led to death (**Ezekiel 33:11 & Ephesians chapter 5**). People often spend too much time playing, gambling, or horsing around for their unknown/blind evil pleasure doing. Instead, people should seek in for the richest knowledge of the heavenly way, where there is peace and eternal life. So, playing sports is very useless and worthless for our social life. Because it will lead us all to judgment death.

Sport is Found in the Scripture

Yes, there are at least six different passage verses that use the word "SPORT": **Genesis 26:8, Judges 16:25, Judges 16:27, Proverbs 10:23, Proverbs 26:19, and Isaiah 57:4**. Yet, all these passage verses do not provide us proof that **ﷻ** allows people to play such sport for fun (pleasure) or for entertainment prize winners. Here why is that most people had often forgotten how the scripture books were translated from. The word "Sport" was not originally in the ancient manuscript books. It's also because of how it was defined differently as well.

The name of "SPORT" somehow was borrowed from the early 14th century Anglo-Norman and Old-Middle French word "desport" or "deport" nor "disport" (modern French déport) "leisure". With the oldest definition in English from around 1300 being

"anything humans find amusing or entertaining". This French word was thus defined by *Randle Cotgrave* in *A Dictionarie of the French and English Tongues* (1611): Deport: masculine. Disport, sport, pastime, recreation; pleasure. These Anglo-Norman and French forms are from the verb *desporter*, *deporter*, etc. (modern French *déporter*), which, among other meanings such as to deport, had that of to entertain, amuse. In the above-mentioned dictionary, *Randle Cotgrave* thus defined the reflexive form: *Se deporter*. [...] to disport, play, recreate himselfe, passe away the time.

People in those old days were thinking of sports as they were looking for people who participate in such activities encompassed in any form of relaxation or diversion. In fact, from the 15th century, there was one meaning of the word sport was to mean "playful" reference to romance and lovemaking. This old defined meaning somehow died off in the 18th century with the word *disport* now an archaic word with a meaning of "diversion from a serious activities matters; recreation or amusement". This paints a much broader picture of sports than how we see it generally covered today, but another 15th century meaning of the word is still recognized today as "Activity of skill and exertion with set rules or customs".

The Oxford English dictionary's earliest evidence of the shortened term "sport" refers to the sport of reading. The Association of sport with physical activity didn't become dominant until the 18th and 19th centuries when it became associated first with the hunting, fishing, and shooting and eventually with more familiar sports like football and cricket in later time. It became more matter of a serious activities challenge as game.

Now let us read in the KJV Bible in Proverbs 10:23:

"It is as sport to a fool to do mischief: but a man of understanding hath wisdom."

Once we read that again, readers like you just might say... it means when a person did something foolish in sport, by his or her troubling act that something a person did something. The need to have a better wisdom understanding how to do the sporting properly. Yet not exactly how that passage verse really tells us that.

Because we need to read the whole chapter carefully. Once we do read it all, we might end-up notice how it speaks of how to be righteous apart from wickedness. This passage actually tells us not to be foolish to ourselves, to horse around or play childless during free time for pleasure fun, instead of to be wise enough to seek in for more understanding wisdom of rightness. The more we play or horsing around for fun or pleasure than seeking in for more wisdom, we likely will not succeed in rightness. You can see why **Proverbs 10:23** can be a little confusing because this one word "SPORT"

has another defining word other than sport game. However, the sport game is still considered to be foolish to do anyway. Because people do play sport-game for fun and for money. Here is one interesting thing about **Proverbs 10:23** in 1599 Geneva Bible, it said: It is a pastime for a fool to do wickedly: but wisdom is understanding to a man. Do you see the word "SPORT" in this older Bible verse before the King James Version (KJV) Bible came into existence? No, of course not. Why is that??? This is because the translator in vain copy and change it. FYI, this Geneva Bible still has this word "SPORT" only in Genesis 26:8 and Proverbs 26:19 but again why not **Proverbs 10:23**? The KJV Bible has six passage verses in the Old Testament Bible using the word "SPORT". It is found in **Genesis 26:8, Judges 16:25, Judges 16:27, Proverbs 10:23, Proverbs 26:19, and Isaiah 57:4**. And one in the New Testament book **2nd Peter 2:13**. You can see why the Geneva Bible and KJV Bible are very similar in English writing but have different words. In our modern-day Bible versions, you will often notice that there is not one or two word "Sport" found in the New Testament books compared to how many are found in the Old Testament books. Except for the Revised Standard Version Bible which comes from Catholic doctrine. Since I personally do not follow or practice the New Testament doctrine anyway, because it's a scam book. 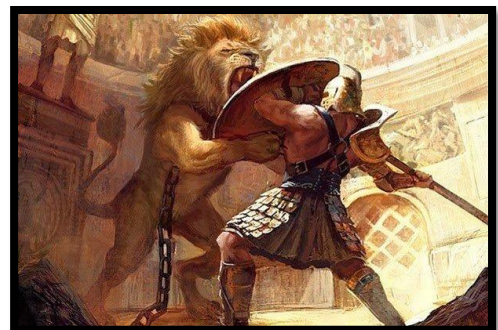
